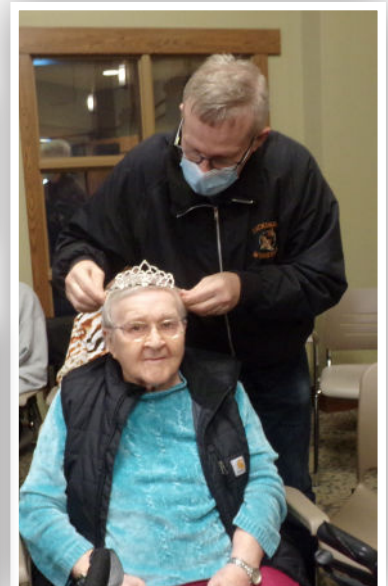

FROM SOCIAL SERVICES

We want to thank everyone and let you know we appreciate everything that you are doing to help us protect our residents from COVID 19. We continue to have to mask at times when there are positive COVID cases in the building or the numbers in the community increase. We appreciate your patience.

If you have received new insurance cards for the new year for your loved one, please bring a copy to us in the social services office so we can have a copy on file. We also encourage you to bring in copies of financial or healthcare power of attorney paperwork if you have not already done so.

We also offer paperwork for the Physician Orders for Life Sustaining Treatment available (POLST). POLST is a written medical order from a physician, nurse practitioner or physician assistant that helps give people with serious illnesses more control over their own care by specifying the types of medical treatment they want to receive. A POLST is not for everyone. The POLST form is designed for people who have chronic health conditions and/or those who are seriously ill or medically frail. A POLST is most useful for people who want less than fully aggressive medical treatment in their current health state. Please contact us if you are interested in completing one of these for your loved one.
