RECIPE

Ingredients

10 pickling cucumbers sliced

- (keep the peeling on)
- 2 onions chopped coarsely
- 1 1/2 cups sugar
- 1 tsp pickling salt
- 2 Tablespoons mustard seed
- 2 Tablespoons dill
- (add fresh dill also if desired) 3 cups white vinegar

Directions

Slice cucumbers & chop onion into a large bowl. Add: Sugar, salt, mustard seed, and dill Pour vinegar on top. Stir all ingredients together. Place in large covered container. Refrigerate.

Safety Reminders for Holiday Decorations

It is that time of the year again when our residents and staff will be busy decorating their homes. We want your loved ones here at St. Luke's Home to have a safe holiday season by sending out the following safety tips, references, and regulatory reminders.

- Artificial Christmas trees and decorations that are non-combustible or flame • retardant may be displayed. However real Christmas trees and wreaths are not allowed.
- WL approved lighting may be used.
- Holiday decorations, including wreaths, ornaments, photos, etc. can be used on resident doors and in the hallways as long as they do not exceed 3 1/2' in depth and they are not blocking the doorway.
- Holiday decorations and wreaths may be hung on the door if they do not hinder the door from closing and properly latching. Over the door wreath hangers are not allowed

No extensions cords or octopus plug-in can be used. Power strips may be used. By following these safety tips and regulations, we can keep our residents and staff safe throughout the holiday season.
